Maatakitj (AKA Clint Bracknell) is a Nyoongar song-maker and guitarist from Albany. His stage name means 'legs like spears' and his songs serve as public service announcements for Country. He has toured Australia with five-time Grammy Award winner Angelique Kidjo, composed for and performed with the world-renowned Kronos Quartet, and produced his debut album with ARIA Award winner Paul Mac. Maatakitj recently performed with an acclaimed Nyoongar ensemble including Kylie Bracknell, Rubeun Yorkshire, Dylan Collard and Kyle Morrison at the 2025 World Expo Osaka, Japan. He is programmed to play at the Nannup Music Festival 2026.



Born in Broome, Western Australia, Kurrungaya Bieundurry, professionally known as Kayps, is an

Indigenous Walmatjarri and Bunuba artist who is quickly making his mark on the Australian music scene. After spending his early years in Fitzroy Crossing, a remote town in the Kimberley region, Kayps relocated to Perth/Boorloo to pursue greater educational opportunities. A gifted writer and producer, Kayps is known for his dynamic approach to music, seamlessly blending lyrical storytelling with melodic vocal performances. His distinctive style combines infectious hooks with high-speed, intricate rap flows - an impressive skill set that many artists take years to develop. Drawing inspiration from his life experiences, Kayps' music is a unique mix of introspection, clever wordplay, and memorable melodies.
